- The incubator represents an innovative initiative that supports lawyers at the early stages of their careers through a modern training framework based on practical application, specialized mentoring, and engagement with justice-sector institutions, opening broader opportunities for professional growth.

Who We Are?

The An-Najah Legal Incubator was established to enhance the practical training of newly licensed lawyers and equip them with the essential hands-on skills required for effective legal practice, while also enabling them to build a strong professional network with relevant legal institutions.

The incubator provides an integrated training and supervision environment that combines practical training, legal professional development, academic follow-up, and institutional networking.

This approach empowers young lawyers to practice law effectively, facilitates their integration into the legal labor market, and strengthens their engagement with justice-sector institutions. The incubator also offers a practical application space for newly licensed lawyers to develop their skills in coordination with relevant legal stakeholders.

Its work is grounded in a set of strategic objectives aimed at developing practical competencies in case management, legal drafting, litigation, professional documentation, and modern legal skills, alongside community service activities that enhance the quality of legal services delivered to local communities.

Vision of the An-Najah Legal Incubator

The incubator offers a comprehensive range of programs and services, including a hands-on professional training program for newly lawyers, supervised work on real case files under the guidance of law professors and practicing attorneys, and applied workshops in legal drafting, litigation, and professional documentation.

It also provides opportunities for volunteer legal work within the Legal Clinic and community service initiatives, particularly targeting marginalized and vulnerable groups. Enrollment in the incubator is free of charge, and selected participants receive a symbolic financial stipend based on competitive, merit-based selection criteria.

This initiative reflects An-Najah National University's commitment to strengthening the principles of justice, building effective partnerships with the justice sector and civil society, and advancing the Sustainable Development Goals.

- Empowering newly licensed lawyers through specialized, practice-oriented training tracks.
- Supporting access to justice by enhancing the professional performance and capacity of new lawyers.
- Strengthening professional ethics and reinforcing the values and standards of the legal profession.
- Promoting applied legal knowledge contributes to improving the legal work environment.

What Does the An-Najah Legal Incubator Offer?

- A competitive, practice-based legal training program for newly licensed lawyers.
- Field-based training on real case files under the supervision of legal experts and practicing attorneys.
- Applied workshops focused on professional skills, including file preparation, legal drafting, litigation, documentation, and volunteer work within the Legal Clinic.
- Professional networking opportunities and institutional visits to partner organizations.
- Engagement in community service, particularly for low-income and marginalized groups.
- Individual and group professional mentoring with legal experts and licensed lawyers.
